Evaluate means make a judgement- (your opinion!)

Justify means back up your opinion!

- Conventions
- Director's interpretation
- Influence of designers

#### **PARAGRAPH STRUCTURE:**

- A) Describe a key moment using drama vocab.
- B) Explain what the director's intention was.
- C) Evaluate whether you ( as an audience member) think it worked or not and WHY
- D) If you didn't like it -Explain what could have been even better





You must aim to write:

An introduction

At least 4 paragraphs with this structure:

A conclusion linking back to the words used in the question.




You MUST answer as an audience member . Start evaluations with :

As an audience member I felt ....

The impact on me as an audience member was ...

The acting made me connect as an audience member because ...





#### Performance:

Engaging: How captivating and interesting was the overall performance?

Compelling: Did the actors hold the audience's attention and create a strong impact?

# Stagecraft:

Inventive: How creatively were the technical elements (set, lighting, sound) utilized?

Seamless: Did the technical aspects of the production integrate smoothly and enhance the performance?

#### Characterization:

Convincing: Were the actors successful in making their characters believable and relatable?

Multi-dimensional: Did the performers bring depth and complexity to their character portrayals?

## Impact:

Memorable: Did the performance leave a lasting impression on the audience?

Thought-provoking: Did the production stimulate meaningful reflection and discussion?
