A table contrasting and comparing the two chosen theatre genres.

Detailed analysis and evaluations of two live theatre performances.

A plan for an audition for an arts festival based on the given brief.

A detailed evaluation and analysis of your audition.


You will have just over two months - but the unit is highly demanding, and it is essential each task is completed as it is worth the most marks out of all your units on this course.

An explanation and introduction of the audition and a performance of the audition itself. This CAN be with a small group, pair or solo.

A rehearsal schedule.

A detailed plan for each rehearsal, recording plans, progress made and plans for next session.

- a) describe a key moment using drama vocabulary.
- B) analyse the director's intention
- c) evaluate whether you liked it or not and why? The impact on you as an audience member.
- D) Suggest what could be even better .
