What makes a panto?

- Pantomimes are a British tradition
- Often performed at Christmas
- Based on fairy tales & nursery stories
- Mainly aimed at children
- Cheeky jokes that only the adults understand!
- Slapstick comedy
- Songs (Sometimes by celebs)
- Audience participation
- Over the top acting & facial expressions





What's the plot? Good battles evil Villain is defeated True love conquers all • Everyone lives happily ever after!



E.g. Ugly stepsisters in Cinderella -Jealous of Cinderella



E.g. Wicked stepmother in Cinderella

E.g. In Cinderella, Sleeping Beauty, Snow White

Hero or Heroine

- -The audience adore them
- Brave and kind
- -They always live happily ever after

- If there are a hero & heroine then they often fall in love

E.g. Cinderella, Snow White, Jack (& the Beanstalk), Aladdin

What's the history of pantomime?

• It all started with Comedia Dell'Arte in Italy in 16th century. Stock characters made the audience laugh with their exaggerated style... just like panto now!

• The British copied this but called it a Harlequinade. It involved lots of silliness and slapstick.

• In 1819 at the Theatre Royal in Drury Lane, the first panto was performed, 'Jack & the Beanstalk'. The audience loved it!

What makes a panto funny?		
Slapstick Comedy	Hilarious falls & collisions	
Melodramatic Acting	Larger-than-life gestures and movements. Exaggerated facial expressions.	
Funny Props	E.g. Cream pies splatted in faces, buckets of water, banana peels	
Jokes & puns	e.g. Why wasn't Cinderella any good at football? She kept running away from the ball!	



Audience Participation

The audience shout out well known phrases to join in with the action on stage
Sometimes the actors throw sweets or water out!

- Make fun of them!
- Pull funny faces at them
- Treat them like friends
- Tell them to be quiet!
