CAREERS UPDATE APPRENTICESHIPS

Farm Hand vacancy - Three Lanes End Farm in West Kirby are looking for an apprentice Dairy Farm Hand who will be offered training via Reaseheath College. They have contacted Hilbre High School directly to try and gain suitable applicants. No formal qualifications are required, but applicants should reasonable at Maths and English and have some technical ability, as much of the farm equipment is automated.

Hairdressing vacancy - Bei Capelli Hair in Greasby are looking for an apprentice hairdresser who will be offered training via Andrew Collinge this summer. No formal qualifications are required, but applicants should be chatty and good at conversing with the public.

CURRENT CONCERNS ABOUT SUBSTANCE MISUSE IN WEST WIRRAL

Calday Grange Grammar School, West Kirby Grammar School and Hilbre High School would like to issue the following joint statement:

In recent months we as educators have become increasingly concerned about the alleged expansion in the availability of drugs in the West Wirral locality. We are very concerned that students may now be more likely to be offered drugs than they were previously or that they may be at a heightened risk of being in the presence of those taking illegal substances. We believe that there is a genuine danger due to dealers coming in from other areas and supplying MKAT, MDMA (Ecstasy) and cannabis, particularly the very pungent variety known as skunk. Students with a large disposable income and/or those who spend the majority of their free time away from family or adult supervision are particularly at risk. As the Spring Break is approaching we are particularly concerned that some students will be vulnerable to this activity.

As schools we have all adopted 'zero tolerance' on drugs and students who are found in possession of any illegal substances or their associated paraphernalia will be dealt with severely, ultimately resulting in exclusion.
