#### REMOVAL OF CONCESSIONARY ACTIVITIES WITHIN WIRRAL COUNCIL LEISURE SERVICES

We have been advised by Wirral Council that from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2016, they will no longer be able to provide free swimming in the school holidays as part of budget savings.

They have asked us to let you know that:

Pupils receiving the Pupil Premium will still be able to swim free and that a process to administer this is still being developed and we will let you know when this is available.

#### **HILBRE LITERARY FESTIVAL 2016**

What a fantastic, action packed week! Our students had opportunities to meet and work with a range of professional writers beginning with Matt Dickinson.

Matt is a cameraman turned writer who has summited Everest on more than one occasion as well as adventuring in the wilds of Antarctica. He shared with us some of the secrets of Everest including how to stay alive as well as stories of squatters stealing food from tents on the ascent. He has written a number of books for young adults including the 'Mortal Chaos' series and 'The Everest Files' - a great read that I highly recommend.

On Wednesday 15 students from different years took part in the 'Wirral Paperback of the year' where they met 7 out of the shortlisted authors who met students in the run up to the final event of the year in June when the winning author will be announced. Students had the opportunity to meet and have their books signed by the authors.

Students also spent time with Rick Broadbent a sports journalist for 'The Times' newspaper. Nick has interviewed every sportsperson worth knowing including Oscar Pistorious, Usain Bolt and Steven Gerrard. He has also ghost written Jessica Ennis' autobiography 'My Story - from beating the school bullies to becoming a Golden Girl'.

Linghams bookshop provided a selection of popular young teen fiction and pupils used their 'World Book Day' vouchers against books they bought. Students gave their own recommended best reads and Mrs Phelan purchased these books for the school library so all students will be able to share in the experience.

On Friday, Catherine Bruton - renowned children's author shared hints and tips on becoming a successful writer. She read part of her latest novel: 'I Predict a Riot' - a gritty tale of loyalty, mistrust and suspense - another highly recommended read!


