Dear Year 13 students, parents and legal guardians

I am writing to inform you of the arrangements for exam results day, **Thursday** 17th August 2023.

You are invited to come into school to collect your exam results between 8:00am and 10am. Please enter school through the pupil entrance and go directly to Sixth Form.

Many of you will know by that point from your university application if you have been successful. If you need any further guidance, we will be available to support you through clearing or ringing universities. Students who have apprenticeships will need to confirm with them that they are still viable.

What are the changes to the grade boundaries?

As in any year, grade boundaries for every specification will be set by the senior examiners after they have reviewed the work produced by students in the assessments. But those senior examiners will be guided in their decisions about where to set grade boundaries by information about the grades achieved in prepandemic years by cohorts of students, along with prior attainment data. That means the 2023 cohort will be protected in grading terms if their exam performance is a little lower than before the pandemic.

What if I am not happy with my results; can I appeal?

No. Any appeal is initially made by the <u>school in advance of results being issued to</u> <u>you.</u> If you wish to request a copy of your script or wish to request a clerical recheck or review of marking, school will advise you how to do this and the forms you need to complete. <u>https://www.jcq.org.uk/wp-</u> content/uploads/2023/07/JCQ-Post-Results-Services.pdf

When do I get my actual exam certificates?

Certificates are sent to schools about three months after results day. You can come into school in the first week of December to collect and sign for them or we can post them to you if you confirm your details. Any unclaimed certificates are generally only stored securely in school for two years, after this time we will return them to the respective exam boards.

What if I get home and need to speak to someone?

We will issue telephone numbers and email addresses on results day and we will have people available to help you throughout that day and the following week.

I cannot pick my results up; what should I do?
