Over 2 weeks, beginning 14<sup>th</sup> March, subjects will be administering mock examinations for our Year 11 students. The mocks for English and Mathematics will take place in the Sports Hall, as follows:

Mathematics Paper 1: Monday 14<sup>th</sup> March periods 1 and 2 Mathematics Paper 2: Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> March periods 3 and 4 English Language Papers 1 and 2: Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> March periods 1 and 2

All other subjects are holding their mocks during normal subject lesson time. This is to avoid disruption to other subjects at this crucially important time.

# YEAR 9 MATHEMATICS MONITORING 4 ASSESSMENT

# BUS SERVICE

We have been notified that from Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2016 Happy Al's will not be providing 8 of the 9 services it recently commercialised following the cancellation of the contracts with Merseytravel earlier this month. This involves 628, 711, 620 Wirral services which serve Hilbre High, Ridgeway High, West Kirkby Grammar and Calday Grammar schools. As the 8 services will not be run commercially after the specified date, Merseytravel will now draw up and consider a number of options to ensure that there is suitable provision from May.

We will keep you appraised of progress in relation to this and communicate further once replacement service provision is finalised.
