What do students study for each Key Stage?

Key Stage 4

The Level 1 / 2 Tech Award in Health and Social Care is made up of three assessed components, two of which are internally assessed and one externally assessed.

- Component 1 - Human Life-Span Development (internal)
- Component 2 - Health and Social Care Services and Values (internal)
- Component 3 - Health and Wellbeing (external)

Key Stage 5

The Level 3 Extended Certificate in Health and Social Care is made up of four assessed units, two of which are internally assessed and two externally assessed.

- Unit 1: Human Lifespan Development (external)
- Unit 5: Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs (internal)
- Unit 2: Working in Health and Social Care (external)
- Unit 14: Physiological Disorders and their Care (internal)

What we think is important about our subject?

About 3 million people work in health or social care. Health care roles include doctors, pharmacists, nurses, midwives and health care assistants, while social care roles include care assistants, occupational therapists, counsellors and administrative roles. Together they account for nearly one in ten of all paid jobs in the UK. Demand for both health and social care is likely to rise so they will continue to play a key role in UK society, and the demand for people to fill these vital jobs will increase. The level 2 course is a good introduction into the breadth of this subject. The level 3 course looks more in depth at the different roles in health and social care and the legislation that covers these settings.

The Curriculum

Key Stage 4

Students will begin studying for the qualification in year 9 and will have five lessons per fortnight. The course is delivered so that each component is covered in one year.

- Year 9 - Component 2 - Health and Social Care Services and Values
- Year 10 - Component 1 - Human Life-Span Development
- Year 11 - Component 3 - Health and Wellbeing

Key Stage 5

The course is delivered over two years, students complete one internal and one external unit per year. In year 12 students complete the two assessments that will be awarded the National Certificate in Health and Social Care, in year 2 they extend this to the Extended certificate in Health and Social care.

- Year 12
 - Unit 1: Human Lifespan Development
 - Unit 5: Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs
- Year 13
 - Unit 2: Working in Health and Social Care
 - Unit 14: Physiological Disorders and their Care
